



## DRESS CODE

A Dress Code applies to both playing and leisure activities while at Credit Valley. All members, guests and staff are obligated to ensure adherence.

Please observe the following general expectations:

- Soft spike policy in effect for all players. Knee length or ankle socks or sockettes are required. Sandals are not permitted on the course and practice facilities.
- Denim, tank tops, tee shirts are not permitted.
- For men, only turtlenecks and golf shirts with mock necks or collars are acceptable and must be worn tucked in.
- Ladies tops may be mock turtleneck, tailored blouses and collared shirts, sleeveless tops with collars and collarless tops with sleeves.
- Golf attire is required on the golf course, for example, cargo pants and shorts (expandable outside attached pockets), and/or casual athletic shorts or surfer-style shorts of any description are not permitted.

If in any doubt prior to play, please consult with your host.  
The complete Dress Code Policy may be obtained from members of the Professional Staff or found within the Club Roster.

## WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES

Please note and respect our cell phone usage policy as outlined below:

- While on Credit Valley property or on the golf course, all WCDs are required to be in silent mode.
- Cell phone use is prohibited in any area of the Clubhouse that provides food and beverage service. This includes both the men's and ladies' locker room lounges.
- Cell phone use is prohibited on the practice range and practice green.
- In all other circumstances, please use common courtesy.

# CREDIT VALLEY GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB

Established in 1930, and through the design efforts of Stanley Thompson, Robbie Robinson, Doug Carrick and most recently Graham Cooke, Credit Valley today enjoys a reputation of being a shot maker's course. It has hosted the Willingdon Cup, the 1993 CPGA championship, where Steve Stricker recorded his first professional victory, the 2001 Canadian Amateur, the 2008 Canadian Ladies' PGA Championship, and the 2010 Toronto Star Amateur. One of this country's golfing greats, Al Balding, the first Canadian to win on the PGA tour, served as the Club's first Head Professional and was associated with the Club for more than 50 years.

We trust that you will enjoy this outstanding property and layout that is Credit Valley.

## HOUSE KEEPING

*Please help leave the course better than you found it*

### Pitch Marks

- Repair your pitch mark on the green and 1 other.
- Do not twist when repairing pitch mark as this tends to destroy the root system.

### Divots

- Avoid taking divots during multiple practice swings.
- Replace divots where practical or use divot mix as provided (in the fairway only).

### Bunkers

- Rake area away from the edges as smoothly as possible after play.
- Place rake outside of bunker away from line of approach.

### Safety

- A Thorguard Weather Watch System is in place. Its horn will sound 1 long blast at the advent of severe inclement weather. All players are required to leave the course and seek shelter until the 'all clear' (3 short blasts) is sounded.

## Facilities

- Washrooms are located by the 18 tee area/6 fairway, the 10 tee area and the 14 green. Please check with the Starter or at the Halfway House for the daily entrance code.
- Refreshments are available at the 10 tee area.
- If walking, at completion of play (18 green), the elevator/funicular is used to return to the upper pathway leading to the Clubhouse. Please review the operating instructions. Upon arrival at the top, ensure that the doors are fully closed upon exiting then return the elevator to the bottom.



## PACE OF PLAY

The expected pace of play at Credit Valley is no more than 4 hours, 15 minutes, based upon a foursome playing 18 holes.

- Be aware of your hole/course position relative to the group immediately in front, not behind.
- If out of position, play ready golf in order to regain position.
- Manage slower players within the group.
- Allow group behind to play through if a clear hole in front occurs.
- Exercise courtesy to the golf course ranger/marshal. His objective is to assist in maintaining a reasonable and pleasurable pace for all golfers. If requested to adjust, please do so.

## CART PATH USAGE

- When using a cart, please follow the established paths where and when possible.
- Avoid wet areas, and use paths adjacent to greens and tee areas.
- Exit the fairway at the beige wooden marker posts.
